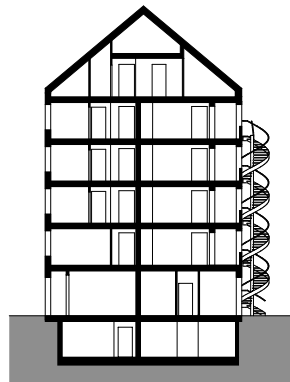


Wohnhaus Schloßstraße

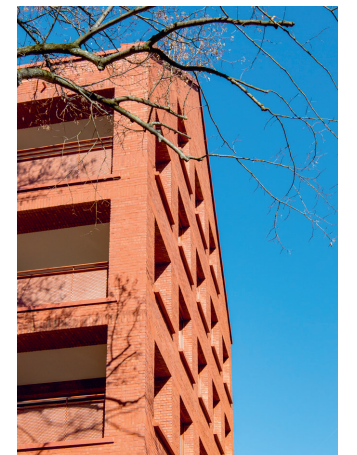
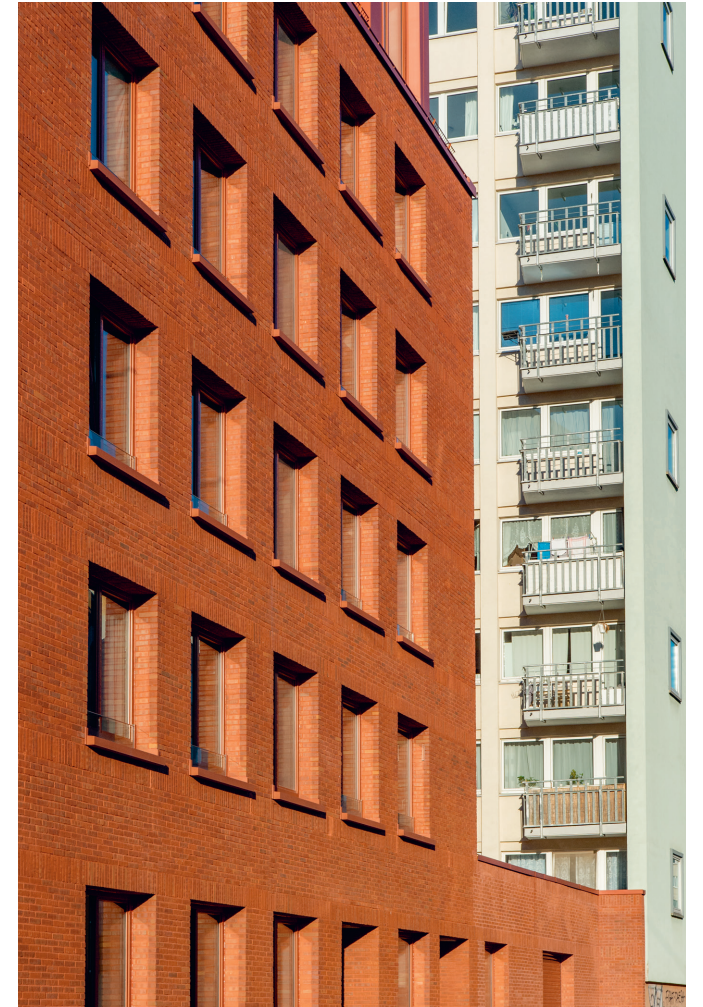


Located on Schloßstraße in the Bockenheim district of Frankfurt, this five-story block (plus roof story) replaces a flat-roofed building that was mainly used for gastro-nomic purposes. It houses 13 apartments and a children's day care center with asso-ciated offices on the ground and first floors. The building reacts to the urban situation between the road on the north side and Von-Bernus Park on the south. In terms of its volume, it continues the development line, eaves height of the surroundings with its pitched roof and blends well into its setting. The street and gable ends have restrained

punctuated façades, while the back of the building has full-height glazing and loggias opening to the garden of the day care center and the park, the entrance is right next to this plot. With its monochrome coloration, the red clinker façade looks both familiar and residential, while also setting a distinc-tive counterpoint to the adjacent faceless housing development of the 1960s.

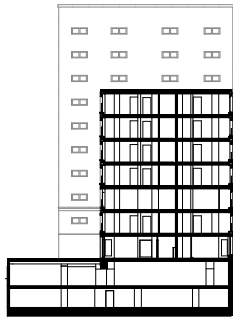


Oskar Residence



In a prominent location on the corner of Flößerbrücke and Oskar-von-Miller-Straße, on the banks of the River Main, 27 freehold flats and 70 serviced apartments are being built on the site of a well-known former brothel called Sudfass. Oskar Residence is divided into an eight-floor residential block and a ten-floor tower with serviced apartments. Together with the refurbished building opposite, which was once the employment agency, this red clinker-clad building functions as a gateway to the Ostend district of the city. It also forms part of a distinctive triple architectural constellation in conjunction with

the broad Saatchi & Saatchi building further down the street and the prismatic double high-rise of the European Central Bank. With its high-quality clinker cladding, Oskar Residence echoes the urban architecture of earlier days. As part of the regeneration measures in this location, the public spaces on Flößerbrücke are to be redesigned and the access to banks of the Main improved.
